

**“Little known Gems of Texas”
with Rose-Mary
June 2, 2011**

*A day with Rose-Mary Rumbley, Dallas' most popular story teller and guide,
promises to be a day of fun, laughter, and stories unheard anywhere else.*

We will leave the FUMC South Parking Lot at 9:00 a.m. via motorcoach. Travel to Cleburne and the Chisholm Trail Heritage Museum. The intriguing lore of the 1886 cattle drive prompted the citizens of Cleburne to establish an outdoor museum to preserve the history associated with the Chisholm era and Texas' rich ranching and agricultural history. See memorabilia and treasured artifacts that help bring the stories of cowboys on the Chisholm Trail vividly to life.

Next we head to Glenrose to Barnard's Mill and Art Museum. Built in the 1860's, the new portion of the mill was built in the 1940s and houses an art museum featuring oils, bronzes and primitive artifacts. Hear the fascinating story of the Barnard family and their establishment of the mill and their tremendous contribution to the area.

Next we head to Hico, home of Billy the Kid Museum. According to Hico Legend, Billy the Kid wasn't killed by Pat Garrett, but died of a heart attack on his way to the Hico News Review office at the age of 90. The museum features memorabilia of the famous outlaw.

We will visit the historical home of internationally known photographer, Frank Rufus Wiseman, built in 1903, and houses a chocolate company as well as antiques.

Lunch today will be at the famous Koffee Kup Café.
